

## The Naismith Coaches Circle & The Tom Young Legacy

The Naismith Coaches Circle honors the first coach, Dr. James Naismith. The core values he integrated into the game are the foundation by which young men and women play the game and conduct their lives. The Hall of Fame created this program to recognize coaches and contributors who have made a difference by teaching and mentoring with these values in mind.

This program offers you the opportunity to honor Coach Young and showcase those that inspired him and those that he inspired. You can pay tribute permanently in the Naismith Circle Courtyard with an engraved granite bench for Coach Young.

In addition, his inspirational story will be included in the Hall's digital/interactive Coaches Circle Gallery that is located on the second floor inside the Museum.

Each bench has its own unique message – customized by (or for) the coach it celebrates.


We look forward to working with you and Coach Young's family to create a message that reflects and honors his journey.

This is an opportunity for guests to learn of Coach Young's story and his inspirations in an interactive setting.




Tom Young began his basketball career as a student-athlete for the University of Maryland in 1952.

After just 1 year playing with the likes of Gene Shue, Young chose to enlist in the U.S. Army where he served a 19-month tour in Germany, highlighting just how special he was.

Returning to college in 1957, Tom Young was a large factor in Maryland's season concluding as #6 in the nation.

Coach Young started his coaching career with Catholic University, who went 134-88 in nine seasons.

Fast forward to 1976, Young led the Rutgers to an undefeated season and a Final Four appearance.




