

The 2023 Spalding Hoophall Classic presented by Eastbay will once again be an event that showcases the best of basketball while honoring its beginnings. As the buses arrive on campus and drive down Alden Street, the next generation of the nation's best basketball players

will pass under the arch that reads, "Welcome to Springfield College – Birthplace of Basketball."

Some of the best NBA and WNBA players competed at The Spalding Hoophall Classic when they were in high



school. Kevin Durant, Elena Delle-Donne, Anthony Davis and Jayson Tatum all played on the same court in Blake Arena that the next generation of future pros will grace from Jan. 12-16.

It is a special trip for everyone involved. Those traveling from far away get the once- in-a- lifetime opportunity to visit the birthplace of basketball. Each team has the chance to visit the Basketball Hall of Fame and walk through the timeline of history that allowed them to get to where they are now. The Hoophall Classic provides a full-circle experience, encompassing not only the competitive aspect of playing the best of the best, but also the chance to appreciate the rich history behind the sport of basketball.

The 2023 Hoophall Classic, per usual, will welcome the top teams and players from across the country, including several returning schools. IMG Academy (FL), Sunrise Christian Academy (KS), Sierra Canyon (CA) and Montverde Academy (FL) are among the top programs that continue to come back to play at the Birthplace year after year.

"I think the Hoophall is one of, if not the biggest high school event of the year because 10, 12 of the best high schools in America play on the same weekend," Montverde coach Kevin Boyle said. "As a basketball fan or college scout or NBA fan, there are really few places that are better to see the better kids in one weekend and also see them against each other."

Montverde has been a long-standing participant at the Hoophall Classic, attending since 2013. Its consistent presence shows why Hoophall is such a special event.

Boyle not only wants to compete at a high level and showcase his team's talent, but also take the time to soak in the history of Springfield and its impact on the game.

"It's something you try to educate the kids on, because I don't know if, when you're young, you're that much into history," Boyle said. "I think some kids are thinking about how the NBA was established, how basketball was established, who were the people that were the cornerstones of it becoming such a great sport and ... [who] make it continue to shine. You want to educate the kids on that and understand what you love and where it came from, and pay homage to some of the people responsible for it."

Although the event features teams from across the country, local teams also have the opportunity to compete at Hoophall and represent New England - including Springfield Central High School (MA).

Springfield Central typically competes at the Hoophall Classic – usually playing multiple games over the long weekend. The Golden Eagles are unique in that they are both local, as well as skilled enough to compete with top schools from other areas of the country.

"I think, first and foremost, we're fortunate and excited about having the opportunity to represent our area. You have one of the biggest tournaments in the country, if not the biggest tournament in the country, right here in your backyard," Central coach Bill Watson said. "You definitely want to have some teams from this area representing the city, the region, the state. We're happy to be one of those teams that are in there annually, and it means a lot to the kids as well."



As a preteen, Judea "Juju" Watkins was determined to increase her commitment to the game of basketball. To get to the skill level she wanted to reach, she could not do it on her own.

Where her game began to significantly grow was not from a basketball camp or a workout program. It started how it does for many young basketball players — in the back yard with Dad.

"When I was 12 — around that age — I started to get really serious about [basketball], and my dad would take his time training me," Watkins said.

Even after she became a FIBA U17 gold medalist as well as the most sought-after high school girls recruit in the country, her training routine remained unchanged.

"It's the same to this date," Watkins said. "My dad is my trainer, so he works with me on my shot, handles — the fundamentals are what's key, and that's what my dad's teaching me every day."

ESPN and USA Today both rank Watkins as the No. 1 girls high school basketball recruit. She is a senior at Sierra Canyon High School in Chatsworth, Calif., and on Nov. 15, 2022, she announced her commitment to the University of Southern California.

Her commitment made national news, as ESPN NBA insider Adrian Wojnarowski tweeted about the announcement to his five million-plus followers.

Watkins' declaration for Southern California ended a long run of communication with different universities. Colleges began reaching out to her when she was 12 years old. The idea of a middle-schooler being contacted by high-profile universities can be overwhelming, but the Watkinses had everything under control.

"I got a lot of letters, and we had a lot of calls, but my mom did her best to kind of filter the process out, and protect me from it," Watkins said. "Especially at a young age, I was just trying to play basketball and not really think about college, so she did a great job helping me maintain focus on the main things."

What Watkins was focusing on was taking over the girls basketball national landscape. It resulted in her playing for the U16 and U17 USA basketball teams, winning the 2021 FIBA Americas U16 Championship MVP and the 2022 FIBA U17 World Cup MVP.

As a junior at Sierra Canyon, she averaged a double-double, with 24.5 points per game and 10.3 rebounds per game. The Trailblazers also won the California Interscholastic Federation Open Division State Championship under Watkins's wing.

While that all occurred, her parents were making a major impact. Whether it was Watkins's father, Robert, contributing to her training regimen or her mother, Sari, handling communication with the top basketball schools in the country, her family was crucial in the pivotal years of her life.

"Their help is much-needed and muchappreciated," Watkins said. "And that's on a daily basis, so I'm just grateful that I have them as my support system, and I don't know what I would do without them, because I would be so overwhelmed."

Along with all of that, Watkins also underwent a change of scenery. She did not initially go to Sierra Canyon, but with



things not going how she wanted at her first high school, she looked elsewhere. She officially transferred to play for the Trailblazers for her junior year.

"There's more of a family aspect with this team that I appreciate," Watkins said. "We're a really close-knit team, and I never really experienced that before on my other teams. So, just to add to the friendship and the chemistry aspect of it on and off the court has really helped my experience with basketball — especially high school basketball."

Luckily for Watkins, Sierra Canyon head coach Alicia Komaki had a lot of knowledge of the guard prior to her arrival to the school. Komaki was the middle school athletic director for Sierra Canyon, and watched Watkins play against her middle school basketball team.

"We were in the same league in middle school and high school," Komaki said. "She's been a local kid and on the basketball team since seventh grade. and we've known about her since sixth grade."

Komaki knew she stood out early on.

"She was always very physically gifted, and kind of ahead of all of her peers in that regard — both in skill and physicality," Komaki said.

"Generally, when you see young phenoms who are gifted in those ways, usually, eventually, other kids start to catch up, but she's kind of continued her dominance by adding to her skill set. She's one of the best athletes, and physical athletes we've seen in a while."

Sierra Canyon is very happy to have Watkins on the team considering what

she brings to the table. Her skill set is on full display, and anyone watching can notice there is something special happening on that court.

"[What stands out most] is the fact that

she can take over in a bunch of different aspects of the game," Komaki said. "So, she can dominate a game just by rebounding, which is pretty impressive. She can dominate a game by shooting a three. She can dominate a game by her mid-range. She can dominate the game at the rim."


In Watkins's much-anticipated decision around her college choice, she ultimately committed to a place less than 40 miles from the high school she currently attends. The decision did not come with ease, as there was a wide array of options for Watkins, However, Southern California's strong and consistent communication made an impression on her.

"As far as the recruiting process, they were always persistent with me," Watkins said. "They never really fell off as far as pursuing me, while some other schools did. And they stuck it out until the very end — my decision was kind of late compared to everybody else, so they were just there for the whole ride. and I really appreciate them for that."

Her choice to stay close to home seems appropriate, as home has always been a large part of who she is. In fact, in her commitment video, she stated, "There's no place like home."

While under the lights of the Galen Center, with potentially 10,000 pairs of eyes gazed upon her, she knows she will still just be a short drive away from another training session with her father. Hoops is never done.

Women's basketball has seen unprecedented growth in the past year across all levels and leagues. That growth will be apparent at the 2023 Spalding Hoophall Classic presented by Eastbay as well. Nine girls teams will hit the court at the Birthplace of Basketball – including five of the 2023 espnW top 100 recruits and four from the Class of 2024's Super 60.

The 2022 tournament featured only two girls games. That number has more than doubled, with five games slated for the 2023 event. Hoophall has a history of showcasing the best male high school

basketball players in the country, as many have gone on to play in the NBA.

The tournament is starting to feature more girls teams, as this year marks the most competitive girls' showcase in Hoophall history. This is partially due to women's basketball's rise across the country, specifically in the NCAA.

La Jolla Country Day School's (CA) Jada Williams, a senior point guard who will compete at the Hoophall Classic, for example, is one of many high school student-athletes to capitalize on name, image, and likeness (NIL) opportunities.



She has over 670,000 followers on Instagram and has sponsorships with Spalding, Gymshark and DICK'S Sporting Goods.

Williams's teammate, senior post Breya Cunningham, is represented by The Sports International Group and is committed to one of the top collegiate programs in the country - Arizona.

For women's basketball players, not only is social media an opportunity to expand their own personal brand, but it is also a way for the sport itself to gain popularity amongst a larger crowd. Social media engagement and the NIL policy has helped grow the sport. Many women's basketball players are also outspoken about social issues - which is intriguing to fans.

According to Forbes, WNBA fans are two to six times more likely to be interested in women's rights and politics, compared with fans of other different professional sports leagues. The league's supporters would rather watch a sport and individual athletes who care about human rights rather than a league that doesn't.

Research from The Rise of Women's Sport Report found that when men's and women's games of the same sport are aired simultaneously, it increases interest in the women's version. Hoophall for example does just this - as the crowd will not only be able to watch star athletes like Bronny James and Mikey Williams but also the dominant women's players from schools like La Jolla Country Day and Sierra Canyon.

The Spalding Hoophall Classic is an opportunity for athletes to be seen and recruited by the top colleges and coaches, as it provides players with the chance to play in a highly competitive

tournament at the Birthplace of Basketball, But for the women, the NCAA, which is the next step for many Hoophall attendees, has a reputation for prioritizing and rewarding men's basketball.

For example, the NCAA's premier basketball championship tournament, also known as 'March Madness,' has been a prime example of systematic gender discrimination through a basketball lens.

In the 2021 tournament, a TikTok went viral after it showed the lack of equipment, gifts, recreation areas, COVID tests, and food options for the women compared to the men's teams. The NCAA did an external review after the video went public, and it was concluded that the NCAA does in fact prioritize men's basketball over women's. How women's basketball is treated in the NCAA directly impacts every other level of the sport - as college basketball acts like a gateway to success for many athletes.

This year's Spalding Hoophall Classic features multiple players who have committed to Division I schools. Sierra Canyon's eclectic guard Judea "Juju" Watkins is espnW's #1 2023 recruit and is committed to the University of Southern California, Her 6-foot-2 frame. combined with elite defensive skills. set her apart.

Behind her at No. 3 on the top espnW top 100 is Jadyn Donovan, a two-way guard for Sidwell Friends (D.C.) who is committed to Duke. Donovan and her team will face off against Watkins and Sierra Canyon on day three of the tournament at 1:30 p.m.

When Ray Allen was offered the head coaching position at Gulliver Prep in Miami-Dade County, Florida, during the summer of 2021, he was tasked with making the rocky transition from an 18-year Hall of Fame career – playing basketball in its highest form – to coaching high school kids.

Allen was coached by some of the game's greatest minds and characters over the course of his basketball life, including George Karl, Doc Rivers and Erik Spoelstra. Every coach Allen ever had made their own individual impact on how he perceived the game, but one coach in particular stood apart from the rest.



When Allen, 47, committed to the University of Connecticut out of high school, he knew he was in for an awakening. UConn was led by the demanding and intimidating Jim Calhoun, so Allen had his work cut out for him.

He soon realized that, while Calhoun may be tiresome to play for, he never asked players to do anything he didn't think they were capable of doing.

"I didn't have any issues with him because I understood what he wanted." Allen said. "What he asked of me and all of us wasn't unfair. It was demanding because he believed we could be better than who we were before we came to him. If you don't want to get better, if you don't want to listen, if you don't want to be coached, then it is demanding. That's the difficult part for some players."

How Calhoun handled the different personalities of each player stood out to Allen. So as he accepted the job at Gulliver Prep, Allen remembered Calhoun's technique and immediately implemented it in his own way.

"(Calhoun) took what he saw in each individual. Some guys he had to yell at, some he didn't, because he knew each person was a different personality." Allen said. "That's what coaching, I've learned, is. You can't cast a wide net over everybody and think that everybody is going to learn the same. You have to customize your teaching to each person because everybody grows up differently and comes from different backgrounds."

Like the majority of professional basketball players, Allen couldn't stay away from the game following his official retirement in 2016. There was no doubt Allen was going to coach at some point - it was just a matter of when and where. Once he learned of the vacancy at Gulliver Prep, Allen sensed it was the perfect fit for more than one reason.

Allen deeply embraces coaching high school hoops, as it gives him the opportunity to mold teenage kids into voung men. In addition, Walter "Ray" Allen III. Allen's oldest son, attends Gulliver Prep and is a senior this season. providing Allen the chance to coach his firstborn as he wraps up his high school career.

The father-son and player-coach dynamic - and finding the line in between - can be tricky to navigate, but Allen has established an easy solution.

He has 17 players on his roster. One of them happens to be his son, but he treats them all the same.

"I couldn't be anywhere else in the world than to be with my son for his last year [of high school]," Allen said. "I'm not biased at all when I'm coaching him, because I look at him as one of my players. There are times where, after the game. I can be Dad, and I can be proud of him. As he's on the floor, I'm just trying to pour into him to get him to work on his game. My sole intention and purpose is to help him get better at basketball."

It would be understandable for a guy like Allen, who is considered an all-time great, to want his first son to follow in his footsteps. Instead, he vows to let Allen III blaze his own trail, but best believe he's going to be there supporting him every step of the way.

"There's nothing that I would [want other] than to see him successful and him happy, and being where he wants to be in his life." Allen said of his son. "We had this conversation maybe three years



ago, and I asked him what he wanted. I said, 'Cool, I'll be with you every step of the way.' And then the universe has a way of making it happen, because the [Gulliver Prep] job opened up. It put me right here where I can help him achieve his goals so he can get to his lot in life, whatever that may be, so he can be successful and proud of himself."

Playing for an NBA champion and Hall of Famer as a high schooler comes with a flurry of emotions. It can't be easy playing for someone that's been an idol – an inspiration – to many young hoopers across the globe.

Recognizing that, Allen implores his players to strive to be better than he was, to use his career as motivation for what's possible if they put in the work.

"I always tell my players, and I don't mean it in an offensive way, 'You guys can't be me, you can't be like me. You need to be better than me," Allen said. "'You have the example that I provide for you, so you get to study what I've done and you get to be better than that.' They have to take what I've done to be able to build off of it."

Basketball is a game that Ray Allen made sacrifices for. He took a chance, he bet on himself, and because of those sacrifices, the game gave him so much in return.

Now, after two NBA championships, 10 All-Star appearances, two All-NBA selections, knocking down the second most 3-pointers in a career in league history and being voted to the NBA 75th Anniversary Team, Allen strives to give everything back to the game by teaching, inspiring and guiding young high school kids to be the best versions of themselves on and off the basketball court.
